Becoming a Servant Educator Requirements

- Must be enrolled full-time at GCU in an education program
- Maintain a 2.0 GPA (3.0 for graduate students) or higher
- Maintain a current Fingerprint Clearance Card

How to Apply

1. Create an account through Job Quest
2. Select "Internship"
3. Search for keyword "Servant Educator"
4. Select open positions for which you are interested.
5. Click "Apply for this Position."
6. Complete the online application.
7. You MUST use your @my.gcu.edu email as your login.
8. You MUST attach a resume.
9. Click "Submit" and keep an eye out for an email verifying your application was received.

What Happens Next

1. If chosen for the position, you will be contacted to submit your Fingerprint Clearance Card and will receive a welcome packet of information.
