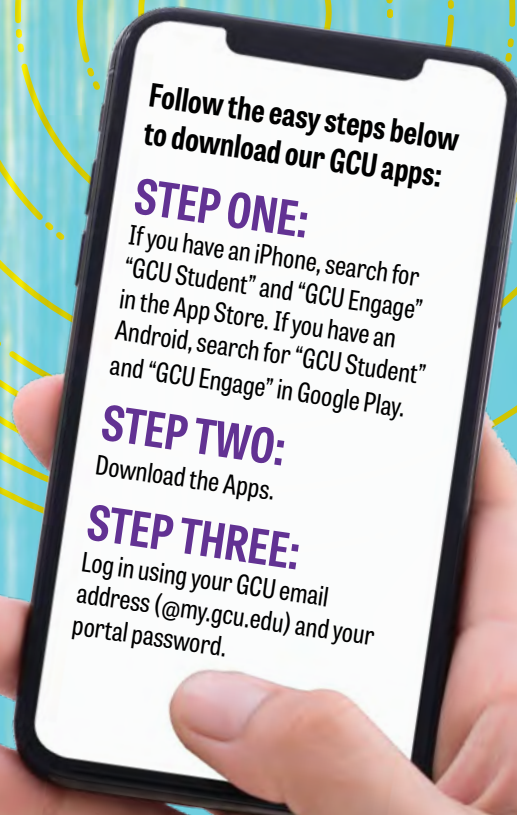

During Express Move-In, volunteers will be on campus to help unload your car and carry any luggage to your suite. Please make sure to arrive during your assigned living area move-in time to take advantage of this perk. Check your mailbox the month before move-in for your Welcome Packet.

This package includes:

Welcome Letter: This letter contains your fall 2019 housing assignment and directions on how to use items in the package.

Campus Move-In Route: This is a custom move-in route to help get you moved in as quickly as possible. Make sure to enter campus at the designated entrance!

Box Stickers: Adhere these stickers to your boxes and luggage. If you run out, no worries! Just make sure each item is clearly labeled with your name, living area name and suite number.

NERVOUS ABOUT ROOMMATE ISSUES? WE ARE HERE TO HELP!

Roommate relationships can be some of the most fulfilling of your college experience. However, discovering how to get along with new roommates in a small space will be challenging, especially if you have never shared a room before. Conflict is inevitable. Handling it effectively helps prepare you for successful relationships in college and beyond. We have a very specific, educational conflict resolution process that is used in campus housing university-wide.

1: TALK ABOUT THE CONFLICT AND CREATE A PLAN FOR RESOLUTION

- Get a roommate communication verification form from your RA
- Set up a time to speak with your roommates
- Identify the issues and create an action plan
- Put the action plan into practice for seven days

2: SCHEDULE A CONFLICT RESOLUTION MEETING WITH YOUR RA

- If major conflict still exists after seven days, your RA will facilitate a mediation with you and your roommate
- The mediation will involve open and honest conversation
- Together, revise your roommate contract and practice for seven days
- Schedule a follow up meeting with your RA

3: SCHEDULE A CONFLICT RESOLUTION MEETING WITH YOUR RD

- If severe conflict still exists after the follow-up meeting with your RA, your RA will recommend an RD mediation
- Your RD will email you to schedule a conflict resolution meeting
- Your RD will work with you and your roommates to determine the best course of action moving forward

CONFLICT RESOLUTION: BEFORE YOU TALK...



SELF-REFLECTION

Your actions may make the problem worse. Pay attention to your presence. What does your body language communicate? Avoid eye rolls and crossed arms.

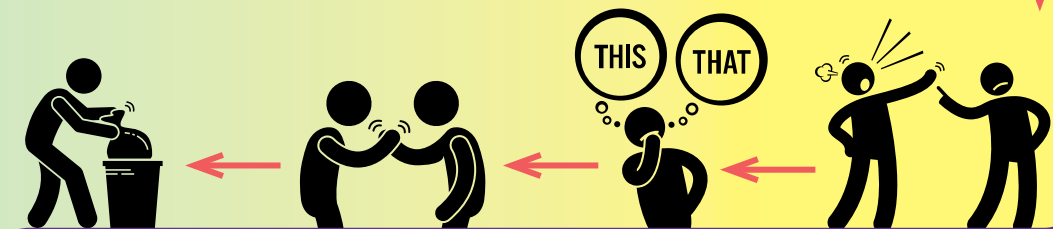
PERSPECTIVE

Put yourself in your roommate's shoes. How would you approach this conflict if you were them?

STATE OF MIND

Prepare yourself to enter the mediation in a calm, solution-oriented state of mind. Reflect on how you have contributed to the conflict.

WHEN YOU TALK...



LISTEN AND CLARIFY

Listen to what your roommate is saying and clarify with questions like, "What I am hearing is that you want me to take out the garbage once a week?"

AGREE

Find something to agree on. The conflict cannot be resolved until the issue is recognized.

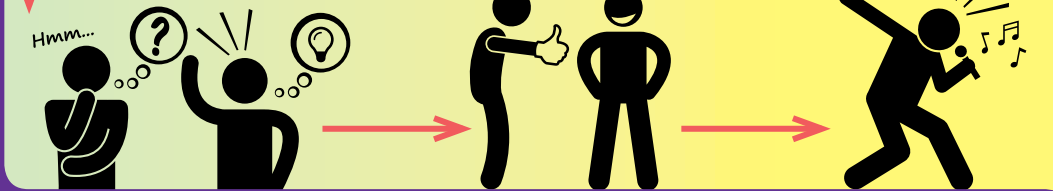
ASK QUESTIONS

Ask questions like, "Why is this bothering you?" to understand your roommate's perspective.

TONE OF VOICE

Roommate conflict can be emotionally charged. Use statements like, "I feel frustrated when..." to talk about conflict.

MOVING FORWARD...



SUGGEST SOLUTIONS

Suggest solutions and listen while your roommate does the same thing. You and your roommate don't have to be friends to live together.

AGREE ON NEXT STEPS

Create a plan to prevent the same conflict from repeating. This will require flexibility and compromise. What will you do if a different conflict arises?

CHECK IN

Ask intentional questions like, "Was I making too much noise last night?" Encourage each other to communicate as you learn to live together.

PUBLIC SAFETY

GCU Public Safety ensures that our community remains safe so you can focus on your life as a student. Public Safety now has a police department with 25 state-certified police officers, in addition to over 150 full-time security guard personnel. They also hire and train 80 student workers to supplement full-time staff during the school year. All Public Safety personnel are trained in CPR, First Aid and AED. Safety escorts are available 24/7 if you ever feel unsafe around campus or between buildings. Public Safety even offers self-defense classes with a GCU sworn police officer!

EMERGENCY BLUE LIGHTS

We have over 60 emergency blue light phones located throughout campus. These are outdoor phones that connect to a Public Safety Dispatcher 24/7. In addition to the outdoor blue light stations, there are also emergency phones in every elevator and in the hall of every student housing building that also connect to a dispatcher.

RAVE ALERTS SYSTEM

In the rare case that there is ever an emergency situation on campus, notifications are sent via text message using the RAVE alert system. We also push notifications out to every network desktop computer and LCD display on campus to make sure our community can take immediate action. Students are automatically entered into the RAVE system when they enroll, as long as they have provided a valid cell phone number.

TIPS ANONYMOUS REPORT SYSTEM

Students can alert us anonymously of criminal activity or other concerning matters 24/7 using the online TIPS system. Tips are received by Public Safety Dispatchers and followed up on almost as quickly as a phone call. Visit gcu.edu/PublicSafety to submit a TIP.

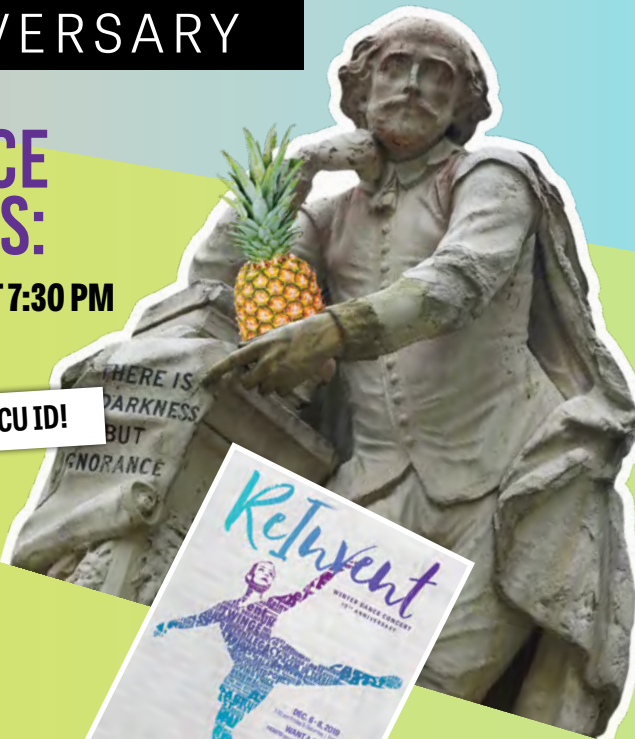

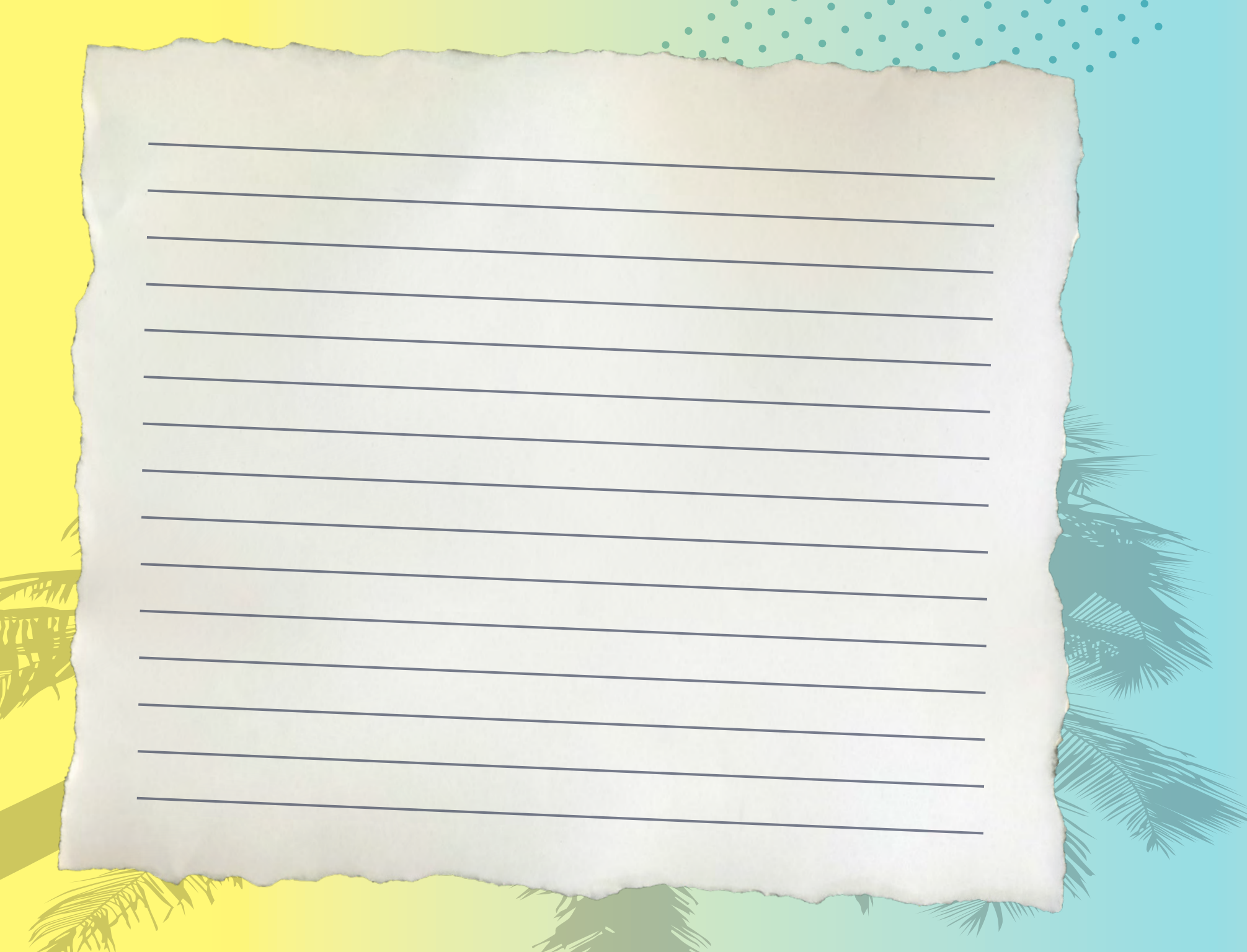
