3 STUDENT RESIDENT **CLASSIFICATIONS**

INCOMING STUDENT (AGES 17 - 19)

To live in the incoming residence halls, you must be:

- An incoming student
- A minimum of 17-years-old at the start of the academic term and should be younger than 20-years-old on Dec. 31, 2021
- Registered as a full-time undergraduate student (12 or more credits, at least eight of which must be taken on campus)

INCOMING STUDENT (AGES 20+)


To live in the residence halls as a transfer student, you must be:

- An incoming student
- Be a minimum of 20-years-old by Dec. 31, 2021 and younger than 26-years-old at the start of the academic term
- Registered as a full-time undergraduate student (12 or more credits, at least eight of which must be taken on campus)

RETURNING STUDENT (UNDER AGE 26)

To live in the residence halls as a returning student, you must:

- Be a GCU returning student
- Be at least 17 years old and younger than 26 years of age at the start of the academic term
- Be registered as a full-time undergraduate student (12 or more credits, at least eight of which must be taken on campus)

SUITE-STYLE LIVING OPTIONS: SINGLE, DOUBLE AND TRIPLE OCCUPANCY







SINGLE OCCUPANCY SUITE-STYLE APARTMENTS

Student will have their own bedroom but will share a bathroom with one other student. Includes kitchen equipped with refrigerator, freezer, oven and electric range top and microwave.

DESCRIPTION:

- Unfurnished (beds and appliances provided, no dishwasher)
- Two floor plans to choose from:
- 3 bedroom, 2 bathroom (three students)
- 4 bedroom, 2 bathroom (four students)
- Living room and fully equipped kitchen in each floor plan
- Opportunity to create individualized space
- Features large shared laundry facilities on each floor; open lobby for community and an outdoor courtyard for student activities

SUITE-STYLE RESIDENCE HALLS DOUBLE AND TRIPLE OCCUPANCY



Students share a bedroom and bathroom with one to two direct roommates and share the entire space with two to three suitemates, depending on their occupancy selection. Double occupancy suites are shared by four students and triple occupancy suites are shared by six.

DESCRIPTION:

- Incoming student residence hall (co-ed by floor)
- Fully furnished suites: 2 bedrooms, 2 bathrooms (2 bedrooms, 1 bathroom in Cypress Hall and Canyon Hall) and large living room area
- Double occupancy: shared by four students
- Triple occupancy: shared by six students
- Features an inviting lobby, breakout rooms for studying, laundry facilities on every floor and massive outdoor courtyard

WHAT'S INCLUDED AND ROOM DIMENSIONS:

- Twin extra-long bed and mattress per student
- Three-drawer dresser per student
- Desk and chair per student
- Modular sectional couch in living room
- Bedroom dimensions: 12'x15'
- Living room dimensions: 12'x21'
- Bathroom dimensions: 7'x7'
- Closet dimensions: 6'x6' in the shape of an "L" with a 2'x2' cutout

Double Occupancy (shared by four students) Student will share a bedroom with one direct roommate. If a student's suite has two bedrooms (most do), that student will have one roommate and two suitemates (four total occupants).



Triple Occupancy (shared by six students) Student will share a bedroom with two direct roommates. There is a limited number of triple occupancy rooms available. Rooms are the same size as double occupancy rooms and provide furniture including a loft bed, extra dresser, desk and chair.

ROOM AND BOARD RATES START AT JUST \$3,325 PER SEMESTER

*Housing and meal plan rate include triple occupancy, suite-style residence hall and \$1,400 Dining Dollars, plus applicable sales tax as required by state law. Prices reflects 2020-21 proposed rate and are subject to change.

ROLES

RESIDENT DIRECTOR

Resident Directors (RDs) are full-time. professional, live-in staff members who provide leadership and supervision for the resident assistants.

RESIDENT ASSISTANT*

Resident Assistants (RAs) are student leaders hand-picked by the Residence Life staff to serve in every living area to help foster community, create accountability for university living area policies and act as a resource to residential students.

LIFE LEADER*

Life Leaders are students within each living area who serve as a resource, offering support and spiritual formation opportunities for residents.

ADMISSIONS AND STUDENT SERVICES **COUNSELORS**

This team is dedicated to meeting student academic and financial needs. Assigned counselors advise on university policies and procedures, keep students on track toward graduation and act as a quide throughout all four years.

PUBLIC SAFETY

Our Public Safety team is made up of sworn police officers and GCU Public Safety employees, including a large team of student workers. By working together, they provide assistance to students and ensure our campus is safe 24 hours a day, seven davs a week.

FACILITIES

Our amazing Facilities employees keep our large campus beautiful. Students are able to put in requests to the Facilities department to repair anything in their room or suite that break throughout the year. Facilities also keeps our classrooms and common areas clean.

RESIDENCE LIFE

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HOUSING AND STUDENT CONDUCT POLICIES

REFRIGERATOR POLICY

To avoid overloading electrical circuits, only one small personal refrigerator and one microwave is permitted per room in each residence hall suite, up to three total (living room counts as a "room").

ROOM ASSIGNMENT CHANGE POLICY

A student may change their housing assignment through July 1 within the housing application. Students are given two tools within the housing application to change their assignment. The room change page is where students can search for open beds. The room swap module is a where students can advertise their bed to swap places with another student. All requests to change assignments after this date will be denied.

HOUSING APPLICATION FEE REFUND POLICY

A one-time housing application fee of \$250 is required of all new residents. This fee is non-refundable and non-transferable.

HOUSING CANCELLATION/ REIMBURSEMENT POLICY

The withdrawal form is located in the housing portal. Contact housing@gcu.edu if you have questions regarding housing withdrawals. Please be aware that you will be held responsible for the remaining contractual financial obligations for the semester as listed on the general housing policy website at gcu.edu/housingpolicies

STUDENT CONDUCT

GCU students are required to treat each other, faculty and staff with courtesy and respect at all times. Each individual plays a role in developing a harmonious campus community and as such is held to the standards outlined in the University Policy Handbook.

COVID-19 POLICY

To avoid the spread of infectious disease, GCU has implemented several important policies. Cleaning and sanitization for living area community spaces, including lobbies, study rooms, laundry rooms have been increased and sanitization stations have been installed in these areas for students to clean before and after use. Guests are limited to campus residents only, no off-campus or overnight guests are allowed in living areas. Health and safety inspections have increased in frequency and now include a new coronavirus-focused cleanliness inspection.

COMMUNITY STANDARDS

GCU is first and foremost a Christian university and as such upholds a commitment to maintaining an environment on campus that honors God. While students do not have to sign a Statement of Faith or be a Christian to attend GCU, they are expected to abide by the Community Standards, College of Theology students are required to affirm additional standards. Please consult the University Policy Handbook for information. The Community Standards uphold certain university values that are believed to enhance the overall moral fabric of the community. The Community Standards identify essential values that GCU students are expected to exhibit in their interactions with one another, faculty and staff. Our expectation is that students reflect what is known as the "fruits of the Spirit" in their behavior. This includes demonstrating love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Our vision is that students strive to treat others as they

would want to be treated.

Our goal is to develop a community based on the biblical principles of respect and honor. We as community members strive to encourage one another, respect one another's differences, speak truthfully and create lasting relationships. We understand that these actions are most possible as a result of choosing to put others above ourselves and to look out for the interests of others.

UNIVERSITY EXPECTATIONS More specifically, the GCU Community Standards include, but are not limited to the following:

- **1.** All students comply with the university policies as a matter of respect for the community as a whole.
- 2. All students demonstrate mutual respect and courtesy to one another, faculty and staff. Physical abuse, verbal abuse, threats, intimidation, harassment coercion and/or other conduct which threatens or endangers the health and safety of any person will not be tolerated.
- **3.** GCU is committed to maintaining a drug and alcohol-free community. Being under the influence of, using, possession of or distributing illegal drugs or possessing drug paraphernalia on campus or at university-sanctioned events will not be tolerated. Failure to comply with these policies will result in police involvement as well as university sanctions.
- **4.** GCU also maintains a dry campus and as such alcohol is not permitted on GCU property. Consuming or possessing alcohol on campus, engaging in under-age drinking, providing alcohol to minors, disorderly or dangerous conduct due to intoxication or driving under the influence are strictly prohibited. Violations of the alcohol policy will be taken seriously and consequences include university sanctions and police involvement if under-age consumption or serving is involved.
- **5.** Guests are the responsibility of the student who is hosting them. Their actions and behavior are viewed as the actions and behavior of the student host.



ROOM SWITCHES

Room switches occur when a resident seeks to move from their current assignment to an open bed on campus. A student is the only individual who may initiate a room switch within the housing application located in the housing portal. Room switch requests made on behalf of students by any other party will not be considered.

ROOM SWAPS

Room swaps occur when two residents seek to exchange rooms with each other. If two students want to swap rooms, both must complete the room swap form in the housing portal before the swap will be considered. Housing Operations will only consider swapping the reservations of the students requesting the change and will not honor requests to change reservations of other students.



HOUSING TERMS TO KNOW

ROOMMATE PAIRING:

Roommate pairing is an optional part of the application process designed to help students who know each other create a linked pair. One member of a linked pair is able to select a bed for each member during their round of selection, helping those students live in the same suite. This optional feature is only available in the first few rounds of the housing selection process.

- Students can only accept one roommate request.
- Roommate requests must be accepted by the Phase 1 deadline to have the ability to select housing on behalf of the accepted roommate.
- Students participating in different selection rounds will not be able to create a roommate pair.
- Students who choose to live in specified housing groups will not be able to create a roommate pair.
- New students ages 17 to 19 and new students ages 20 to 25, will not be able to create roommate pairs with each other and will select from different designated beds.

Q: HOW DO I GET MY PERMIT?

A: Parking permits go on sale in June. To obtain a permit, visit gcu. thepermitstore.com and input your last name and student ID number. Parking options are based on your housing location and student status, whether you are a resident, commuter or part of a cohort. You will need your license plate number and the year, make, model and color of your vehicle to purchase a permit.

Q: HOW ARE THE PARKING GARAGES ASSIGNED?

- A: Parking garage assignments are based on two criteria:
 - 1. Whether you are a campus resident or commuter.
 - **2.** For residents, assignments are generally the closest parking garage to their living area.

PERMIT PRICING

Permit prices are for the whole school year. Parking garages: \$150 Motorcycle permits: \$100

If you will not be parking on campus for the entire year, you may request a partial parking fee refund.

TIP FROM A FORMER STUDENT:

Purchase your permit as early as possible. Permits are sold on a first come first served basis and there are limited spaces in each garage. If you want a space in a garage closest to your housing, don't procrastinate!

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
