

SUMMER HOUSING FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: Why is summer housing only in certain buildings?

A: Due to a large population of returning students moving in early for leadership positions or employment, we need to have our summer students in a space where they can comfortably stay all summer long.

Q: Can I live with my friends over the summer?

A: Yes, we added the group process to the summer application and you can create groups of two or four members. One student acts as the group leader and creates the group when they complete their application. The other students then join the group when they go through the application. The group leader will need to log in and verify the group by April 16.

Q: Can I choose my room when I apply for housing?

A: No, to make the process as smooth as possible, you are randomly assigned to rooms when the application process has closed. Roommate groups are assigned to suites together. Students who apply on time will receive their summer housing assignment before the end of the spring semester.

Q: How do I notify housing which occupancy type I would like to live in for the summer?

A: You will be able to select your preference to live in single, double or triple occupancy in your application. Summer housing is limited and each occupancy type is extremely limited. Price point preferences will be fulfilled based on the date you complete your summer application, availability and move-in date. Preference for price point will be considered but not guaranteed.

Q: When will I be billed for my summer housing and meal plan?

A: Meal plan charges will be posted at the time of application. Housing charges will be posted when you are placed in a booking.

Q: Where can I park this summer?

A: Parking for students living on campus is in the Grove Parking Garage. For more campus parking information, visit the [campus parking webpage](#).

Q: What do I do with my stuff in between spring move-out and summer move-in?

A: If you are moving into your summer housing assignment on May 7, you can leave your belongings in your spring room. Otherwise, you need to move all of your belongings out by April 23 at 3 pm and move them back during your summer move-in appointment.

Q: What if I cannot be there for the move-in at the beginning of summer?

A: If you are unable to make Summer Move-In on May 7, you need to move all of your belongings out by April 23 at 3 pm and email the summer RDs at summerdds@gcu.edu to schedule a new time to move in. Appointments can only be made Monday – Friday from 9 am – 5 pm and must be made at least 24 hours in advance.

Q: Can I submit a housing exception to move in at another time?

A: No. Unfortunately, exceptions will not be made. Students who arrive outside of their selected date will be charged an improper check-in fine of at least \$150.

Q: When can I move into my Fall 2021 assignment?

A: Fall 2021 move-in will begin Friday, Aug. 6 from 9 am – noon. Please plan accordingly! Students who will be living in any of The Rivers Apartments for Fall 2021 will move into contingency housing on Aug. 6. Students in The Rivers Apartments will remain in contingency housing until their scheduled fall move-in time.

Q: What if I cannot be on campus on Aug. 6 for fall check-in?

A: You must be present for check-in on this date. Appeals will not be accepted and you may be assessed an improper check-in fine of at least \$150.

Q: What if I do not have a Fall 2021 housing assignment?

A: Contingency housing is available to students who do not have a Fall 2021 housing assignment. Students will check into contingency housing on Aug. 6 and check out of contingency on Aug. 13.
